3 Year Old Kindergarten

The benefits of Learning through play

Educators draw on their values, professional knowledge and skills as they pay close attention to the interrelated pedagogical practices outlined in the Early Years Learning Framework:

- holistic approaches
- responsiveness to children
- learning through play
- learning environments
- intentional teaching
- cultural competence
- continuity of learning and transitions
- · assessment for learning

Planning and teaching for learning through play has long been considered a key feature of early childhood education—a feature which distinguishes it from other sectors of education and is deeply grounded in our history. The EYLF has a specific emphasis on play-based learning and teaching. It acknowledges that children have a right to play under the principles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNICEF, 1989).



SunSmart Reminders



Hats & Sunscreen

Sun smart times have commenced and all children must wear a hat at all times when outdoors.

Skin cancer is one of the most preventable cancers. UV exposure during childhood and adolescence has a big impact on future skin cancer risk. Reducing UV exposure reduces skin cancer risk.

Other strategies we implement to protect children:

- Our educators will apply sunscreen to all exposed skin 20 minutes before going outdoors.
- We have had our shade sails put back up and we will set up activities in the shade and direct children to shaded areas.
- Please also ensure you send your child in a T-shirt and not a singlet to protect their shoulders.

UV rating. What does it mean?

Ultraviolet (UV) radiation is a type of energy produced by the sun and some artificial sources, such as arc welders and solariums.


The sun's UV is the main cause of skin cancer. Too much UV exposure also causes sunburn, tanning, premature ageing and eye damage.

The UV Index

The World Health Organization's Global Solar UV Index measures UV levels on a scale from 0 (Low) to 11+ (Extreme). Sun protection is recommended when UV levels are 3 (Moderate) or higher.

The UV level is affected by a number of factors including the time of day, time of year, cloud cover, altitude, location and surrounding surfaces.

The UV Index and the sun protection times. The sun protection times are issued when UV levels are forecast to be 3 or higher. At this level there is a risk of skin damage for most Australians.

Storypark



What is Storypark?

Storypark is an easy-to-use private online service that helps teachers, parents and families work together to record, share and extend children's learning.

Your child's development is documented in photos, videos, stories, moments, notes and responses.

Each family will receive an invitation to Storypark. It is free to join and use.

Parents can also choose to invite other family members to share the joy of their child's day and allow others to follow the child's development, look at photos and videos and comment on stories!



Why do we use Storypark?

Storypark supports parents and families to:

- Be part of their child's day no matter where they are.
- Extend their child's interests and learning.
- Record their child's stories and keep them forever.
- Share and collaborate with wider family in a safe, private environment.
- Perfect for any parent or family situation, including working couples, separated parents and overseas relatives.
- It's totally free for families to access.

How do I access my Storypark account?

Download the Storypark for Families iOS app or Android app today and log in using your Storypark account. Upon enrolment, you will receive a link to create your child's profile.

CovidSafe Update



Drop off and Pickup procedures

IA friendly reminder about our current drop off and pick up procedure here at Butterflies.

We ask that families DO NOT enter the children's rooms at morning drop off or evening pick up times but rather wait at your child's room door for an educator to greet you.

We introduced this new drop off and pick up procedure as part of our COVIDsafe policy. Although we introduced this procedure due to health and safety reasons, we saw many benefits with children's social and emotional well being.



We saw benefits for children who were being dropped off in the morning. Children were able to separate more easily without the distraction of many other children and educators around with unnecessary sensory stimulation impacting the drop off.

We saw benefits for children who had already been dropped off who were still settling into the room. Previously, each time the room door would open and another parent would walk into the room, this would unsettle the children over and over.

Benefits seen at afternoon/evening pick up

We also saw benefits in the afternoons and evenings when children are being picked up. Children who are here later do not have a large number of parents entering the room one after the other to collect their children before they themselves are picked up. Previously, each time the room door would open and another set of parents would walk into the room, children would become unsettled or even anxious over and over again with each parent entering the room.

Longer term benefits

We did not expect to see these benefits to occur from implementing a new procedure due to COVID but now that we have, we have a duty of care to keep these procedures in place and continue to provide a safe, secure and predictable environment for all of the children here at Butterflies.

If you arrive to your child's room door and the children and educators are all outside you may proceed through the room to the next door. Please ensure you DO NOT enter the yard, where the children and educators are present. Please take note of family grouping rooms, if your child is no longer in their room.





Family Grouping

Family grouping is in the Ladybugs room in the early morning, and the Witchetty grubs in the late evening.

We thank you for your understanding as we do our best to provide a safe, secure and predictable environment for all children here at Butterflies.


